How to submit your abstract

Abstract format and guidelines

- Abstract body text should be a maximum of 200 words
- Abstracts must show the title of the paper, name of presenter/s, contact details and their affiliations
- Abstracts should clearly demonstrate positive outcomes (for people, organisations, workforce) or lessons learnt from outcomes that weren't successful
- Abstracts showcasing research should clearly demonstrate how it can be applied to practices
- A brief biography (100 words) for each presenter must also be submitted.

Abstract submission process

Review criteria

Abstract submissions will be reviewed and selected by NADA based on the following criteria:

- Applicability – Abstracts should propose presentations that will allow audience members to walk away with practical lessons learned and actionable next steps to help advance their work
- Quality – the material is well-organised and prepared
- Thematic fit – Abstracts will be selected based on its fit with the theme of client outcomes, experience and feedback

Applicants will be notified of their success by Wednesday 24 July 2019.
